## English Language: Top Tips for Success at A Level

## **Teacher tips:**

- 1. Do some wider reading:
  - a. A-Level resources (e.g. eMagazine, library resources)
  - b. Material aimed at a non-specialist audience (e.g. programmes such as 'Planet Word', articles about English language in broadsheet newspapers).
- 2. Stay organised (keep a file, order all notes and hand-outs for future reference).
- 3. Learn specialist terminology regularly and use this in both speech and writing.
- 4. Re-read class notes at regular intervals and be independent in developing and consolidating knowledge.
- 5. Discuss language issues outside of lesson time. Relate issues and debates in English language to real world scenarios.
- 6. Show a willingness to improve accuracy of writing/essay writing techniques.
- 7. Research other related areas of study for personal interest (e.g. speech therapy).
- 8. Manage time and workload effectively, particularly in relation to coursework.
- 9. Act upon advice given on coursework, classwork or verbally.
- 10. Aspire to be an expert in the area of English language.

## Student tips:

- 1. Ensure the mark schemes are understood for both exam answers and coursework.
- 2. Learn full details of theories and research studies.
- 3. Catch up with missed work and ensure the content is understood.
- 4. Practise analysing any text (e.g. a bus ticket) to refine skills.
- 5. Identify links with other subjects wherever possible.
