Film Studies: Top Tips for Success at A Level

Teacher tips:

- 1. Research around film studies through shows such as The Kermode and Mayo film review-(podcast or live) on BBC Radio 5 live and Soundtracking with Edith Bowman.
- 2. Stay organised (keep a file, order all notes and hand-outs for future reference).
- 3. Learn specialist terminology regularly and use this in both speech and writing.
- 4. Re-read class notes at regular intervals and be independent in developing and consolidating knowledge.
- 5. Discuss films and their cultural/social/political significance outside of lesson time. Relate issues and debates in the world of film with real world issues.
- 6. Learn about the people who make films (directors, producers, film studies etc.) and research how they have progressed through their careers.
- 7. Research other related areas of study for personal interest (e.g. specific directors such as Alfred Hitchcock and film movements such as film noir).
- 8. Manage time and workload effectively, particularly in relation to coursework.
- 9. Act upon advice given on coursework, classwork or verbally.
- 10. Aspire to be an expert on the subject of film as an art form.

Student tips:

- 1. Watch films of a range of different genres, even those you wouldn't normally watch.
- 2. Complete homework on time!
- 3. In and out of lessons, consider elements of film when watching anything.
- 4. Be ready to analyse small details you wouldn't catch when normally watching.
- 5. Keep up to date with detailed notes.
- 6. Practise your essay-writing techniques- it is mainly an examination-based subject.
