## **Product Design: Top Tips for success at A Level**

## **Teachers' Top Ten Tips:**

- 1. Make every lesson count.
- 2. Attend every lesson possible. If there is a valid reason for missing a lesson, be proactive in ensuring that you copy up notes and catch up on any missed home learning.
- 3. Seek advice immediately if you do not understand a concept.
- 4. Keep up to date with compulsory home learning.
- 5. Manage your time between all of your subjects to balance workloads, paid work and relaxation time. This will help you reach deadlines and not burnout.
- 6. Keep detailed, well presented notes and organise these carefully under clear headings so you have a good basis for revision.
- 7. Re-read your class notes to help reinforce understanding and seek advice if you are unsure of any topics covered.
- 8. Act on feedback given by teachers to help improve your work.
- 9. You will need to become familiar with a range of tools, processes and materials in relation to Product Design. This will help inform your design decisions and subject understanding.
- 10. Practice using a range of CAD based software in your own time to improve your efficiency and capabilities implementing CAD within your work.

## Student advice 'Things I wish I had known before starting AS Product Design'

- Make sure notes are clear and easy to read.
- Every minute counts, making use of every second in the workshop is vital. Don't leave it to the last minute!
- Get as much experience using tools and machines as possible, this lets you just get on with your work.
- Don't cling on to ideas that the teacher advises against, if they say it won't work it probably won't!
