



UCAS timeline

<u>Friday 23 September 2022</u>: Oxbridge/Medicine/Dentistry/Veterinary applications MUST be completed and submitted by this date. The deadline for these is earlier than all other applications, so it is very important that you meet this deadline.

<u>Friday 21 October 2022</u>: You should aim to have completed and submitted your UCAS application by this date. Our aim is to process as many forms as possible by the October half term.

<u>Friday 11 November 2022</u>: FINAL DEADLINE. We would like all UCAS applications completed by this date. This ensures that we can work through all applications and get them sent off by the UCAS deadline (It also means you can concentrate on your A-levels rather than worrying about completing your application). If you submit your application after this date, we can't guarantee that it will reach UCAS by their deadline and will, therefore, be classed as late.
