

A CLOSER LOOK: GENERAL ELECTION 2024



Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has called a UK general election, which will take place on 4th July. This will give registered voters across the UK the chance to vote for the party that they want to run the country, though it is vital that they bring photo ID with them in order to do so.

The UK is divided into 650 areas, called constituencies, and each of these chooses one Member of Parliament (MP) to represent their constituents in the House of Commons, Westminster.

After the votes have been counted, the King will ask the leader of the political party with the most MPs to become Prime Minister and to form a Government. This will be followed by the State Opening of Parliament and the King's Speech on 17th July. The Government will then outline its priorities for the months and years ahead.


South Africa seeking coalition
