

<u>A LEVEL GERMAN</u> (Edexcel specification)

A Level German is essential preparation for degree courses which include this language; German can also be combined with a wide range of other subjects at university.

German Reunification

Students will also study one text and one film.

Assessment

The assessment scheme is constructed around three components:

Paper 1: Listening, reading and translation	A Level 40 per cent
Paper 2: Critical and analytical response in writing	A Level 30 per cent
Paper 3: Speaking	A Level 30 per cent

Independent study

Tasks for study outside classes will include extensive reading of German books and periodicals; making use of self-study resources including German radio and podcasts; researching topics independently through the Library and internet; additional grammar practice. Each student will have an individual weekly tutorial with the German Assistant.

Visits abroad

Students will be encouraged to take advantage of opportunities to visit Germany.
