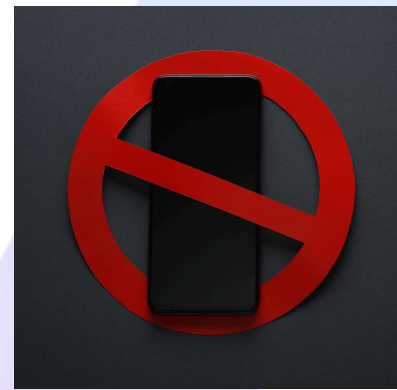
SECOND ASSASINATION ATTEMPT

ACADEMY BANS SMARTPHONES

A national academy chain with 35,000 students has become the first in England to ban smartphones at its schools. The Ormiston Academies Trust, who run 44 state schools, has already started bringing in the ban.



BAN ON JUNK FOOD TV ADS

A ban on junk food adverts being shown on TV before 9pm will come into force on 1st October 2025, the Government has confirmed. This is being enforced to help tackle childhood obesity.
