

US President-elect Donald Trump has picked Elon Musk to take a lead on Government cost-cutting when he returns to the White House next year. Tech billionaire Musk, who has called for huge spending cuts, will take on the role alongside Vivek Ramaswamy.



A PLOT TWIST

Children's reading in the UK has hit a "crisis" point, with the number enjoying it in their free time dropping to just one in three, a report suggests. The number of under-18s who say they enjoy reading has hit its "lowest level" since surveys began in 2005.



UP TO 115 POST OFFICES AT RISK

Up to 115 Post Office branches and hundreds of head office jobs are at risk as part of a shake-up of the business. The Communication Workers Union (CWU) said that it was "immoral" to propose such plans as the inquiry into the Horizon II scandal continues.
